and also, more generally, in terms of continuous learning, professional development, and long-term collegial relationships and friendships.

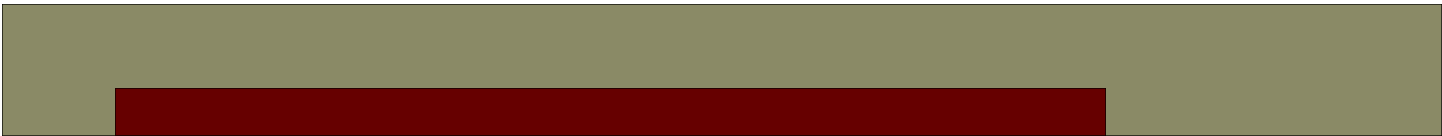
